




#### **Unemployment Impacts of COVID-19**




#### **Employment Impacts of COVID-19**




### Santa Barbara Higher Wage Industry Clusters: Feb to Dec 2020

## Job Quality in Santa Barbara County, Feb to Dec 2020



# How do we expect employment to evolve in Santa Barbara?

#### **PPP Loans Disbursed in Santa Barbara County**

\$967 million in funds across 8,120 businesses (44%) that employ more than 90,000 workers



#### A Slow Recovery for Some

#### **Slow Return**

- Decreased demand for tourism, specialty services & business travel
- Recovery from initial drop, but no return to 100% for 12 to 24 months

### Hardest Hit Industries (19% of jobs in Santa Barbara County)

- Tourism, Recreation, and Hospitality
- Other Services (Dry Cleaning, Salons, Churches & Civic Organizations - like youth sports)

Strong recovery from initial dip


### **Growth Industries (7% of jobs in Santa Barbara County)**
